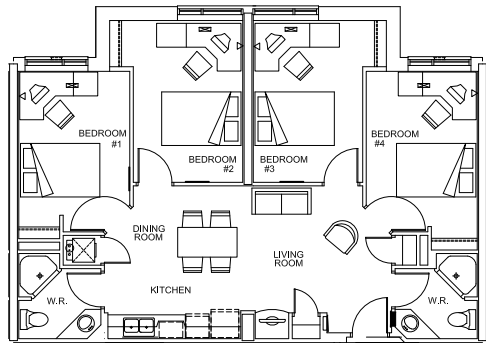

London is known as the “Forest City” with over 200 parks and 100 km of walking and hiking trails. The city is located in a region surrounded by the world’s largest freshwater lakes.
